

## Designing out hotspots

### Derbyshire BREW Project

In 2007 the Derby & South Derbyshire Business Resource Efficiency and Waste (BREW) programme commissioned Keep Britain Tidy (formerly ENCAMS) to review approximately ten fly-tipping hotspots in each of the local authorities in Derbyshire with a view to producing a report with recommendations on how each site could be improved to prevent fly-tipping.

The project involved collecting a wide range of good practice case studies on a variety of sites with a wide range of characteristics, from rural lay-bys to town centre recycling sites. The recommendations also provided potential solutions with a range of cost implications, from low cost vegetation maintenance to higher cost barriers and infrastructure.

Each individual local authority received their own personalised report with good practice specific to their hotspots and relevant recommendations. Where the recommendations were implemented reductions in fly-tipping have been noted.
