

## Reporting Fly-tipping

### London Borough of Lambeth

Lambeth places great emphasis on the need to deliver a positive impact on the overall level of environmental quality within the borough and is continually working to bring about improvements which impact positively on the quality of life experienced by those who live and work in the borough.

Environmental Monitoring Officers are constantly monitoring the borough to ensure it is maintained to a high standard. Potential fly-tipping offences are reported via hand-held computers, these reports are sent directly to both the Environmental Crime (Enforcement) Unit and the Cleansing & Refuse contractor. Evidence is gathered and the waste is then removed.

Council stakeholders are encouraged to report any incidents of fly-tipping that they come across or witness. There are a number of methods available for stakeholders to report incidents of fly-tipping; this can be done via email, telephone, fax or in person at the council offices.

Lambeth promotes the use of their free [special and bulky collections](#) services; which allows residents to request free collections of standard bulky refuse such as old furniture, mattresses and garden waste. Large metal goods such as cookers, washing machines and central heating radiators are also collected for recycling. Fridges and freezers are collected separately to ensure they are disposed of correctly.

The Environmental Crime (Enforcement) Team will prosecute all offenders who are caught fly-tipping, this also serves to reinforce the message that fly-tipping is illegal.
